Congressman honors Eagle Scouts

U.S. Rep. Jeb Hensarling recently honored Dallas County Eagle Scouts from Lake Highlands and East Dallas at a special recognition ceremony at Central Lutheran Church. Troop leaders, parents and guests attended the recognition ceremony with the Eagle Scouts.

“Today’s Eagle Scouts are the leaders of tomorrow,” Hensarling said. “Receiving my Eagle Scout was one of the proudest moments of my life, and I welcome these young men to the ranks of some of America’s most dedicated servants.”

Only about 5 percent of all Boy Scouts

achieve the rank of Eagle Scout.

“The values, ethics, and morality you learn through scouting is critical to you, but it is critical to this nation as well,” Hensarling said in his address to the Eagle Scouts.

The congressman reminded the Scouts that they represent the best of the best in scouting.

“My charge to you is that you make sure that Eagle Scout is not just a milestone or destination in your life,” Hensarling said. “Instead, for your sake and your country’s sake, make sure Eagle Scout is a way of life.”
